Dillon was instrumental in helping the County of Essex become the recent recipient of the 2011 Robert Pullyblank Municipal Achievement Award (formerly known as the Essex Region Conservation Authority Award). We nominated the county for their involvement in the construction of a large fish habitat area that was built to compensate for alterations to municipal drains along County Road 22.

Dillon team members designed a large area of fish habitat compensation, developed a comprehensive instruction package for contractors to protect the northern map turtle - a species at risk - and oversaw the construction of this naturalized area.
